## Uccello Tipping Kettle indigo.



# 1.5 Litre capacity kettle that tilts while you pour, so you don't have to lift, strain or balance a heavy kettle. Designed for those with limited reach, mobility, dexterity, visibility, and strength.

#### There are 3 main parts of this device.

- 1. **Cradle** holds kettle & tilts down, allowing you to pour boiled water without the need to lift the kettle. The base of the cradle is sturdy, with non-slip feet.
- 2. **Kettle** the button to open lid is on top of the spout, the water level indicator is on the front side, the tactile power switch is at the back. The handle is ergonomically designed for easy lifting and pouring.
- 3. **Uccello grip mat** (or 19cm circular Dycem anchorpad) sits at the front of the feet of the kettle. This can be used as a non-slip position locator for cup when pouring from your Uccello kettle and is useful for clients with visual impairments.

#### **Operating instructions:**

- 1. To fill kettle, either lift out of cradle, or open the lid and fill with a jug of water. For those with limited vision, who cannot identify the water level indicator, completely empty the kettle and fill with a 1.5L measuring jug or 6 cups of water to ensure that you don't overfill.
- 2. Ensure lid is clicked firmly in place before connecting to the power outlet. It is a quiet boil when in use.
- 3. For a safe and easy pour, insert Uccello grip mat at the front feet of the kettle. Insert your mug in the centre of the mat & position the handle of the mug against the front of the kettle. This will align your mug to ensure the boiling water pours directly into the mug. Please take your hands away from the mug for additional safety.

### 4 additional tips for safely pouring boiling water

- 1. Practice with cold water. This will help familiarize the direction and rate of the water being poured.
- 2. Use the same mug as this will assist with the correct placement and positioning every time.
- 3. Use a liquid level sensor to assist you identify the water level and know when to stop pouring.
- 4. Use a colour contrast when selecting your mug to drink from.
